HCC Annual Meeting Minutes April 3, 2025

- 1. **Treasurer's Report** John emailed reports to all members prior to the meeting. The 2024 numbers are good; 2025 numbers are incomplete. Bank balance is \$22,000. The HCC raised more money this past year compared to 2023, about \$15k, in addition to the \$15k ARPA funds. Some details are: insurance refund \$600, over \$500 from ice cream. Expenses were higher as expected now the Hall is in use year-round. Electric expenditures increased in 2024; propane also increased. HCC were awarded \$15,000 in ARPA funds, and we spent about \$18,000 (and enjoyed a lot of volunteer labor!). Plant swap generated more money in 2024 than in earlier years and included proceeds from food.
- 2. **Election of Trustees for terms ending in 2025** John Kirk (Treasurer, Trustee 2022) and Joan Courser (Trustee 2022) were unanimously voted in for another 3-year term, the latter in absentia. Laurel Copeland was elected as Clerk.
- 3. 5th annual Edie Fenton plant swap 5/24/2025, 9-1 at the Hall Bonnie will need volunteers to dig up plants 1-2 days before the Plant Swap. Laurel & Liz volunteered for 5/22. Linda L will handle the media; Diana C & Francisco will help post flyers. LL would like photos of past Plant Swaps.
- 4. Cafe schedule Should we bring Thursday back once the heat is unneeded? Ask people what they want. Schedule a few special events. The Historical Society story time was wonderful. Diana C provided a list of ideas. Bettye described her jewelry crafting idea that will start this Saturday April 5.

- —COW and pig scraps can be composted from Senior Meal as well as Café; Laurel will help Bettye set this up again.
- —Plant repotting workshop, library services from Whitingham Free Public Library (Mark is our liaison), movie night? Mark will find out whether we can show a movie.
- —Cemetery Commission work & repairs
- 6. Ice Cream Wagon events volunteers Cassie, Bettye, Mark, Gary, Laurel. Needs tires.

- 7. Food share cupboard at TO; container garden at Hall (herbs, tomatoes, peppers)? Pollinator garden? Deerfield Valley Lions (Mark) gave us \$100 for the food share. **LL will ask Patty Dow**; **someone (Mark?)** will talk to Cara about leaving more food in the **PO**.
- 8. Dues optional \$5/year dues are welcome; 13 people paid on the spot.
- 9. Garland stove in Hall kitchen leaks gas, has 4 pilots burning all the time, has 6 burners but small oven box. Cannot be vented properly. Gary endorsed keeping the stove as it's a professional stove and would cost a great deal to replace. Bonnie suggested opening the window to vent the kitchen. The lack of bigger oven still an issue which a portable oven might address.
