MUSINGS ON NAMES

Last month, while considering the few roads in Halifax that are not named after persons, I wondered why anyone would name a road Sodom. Our good neighbor Pam Baker, who lives on Sodom Road, was ready with the answer.

"Using the name 'Sodom' in a road or town comes from colonial times. Indeed, all New England states but New Hampshire and Rhode Island have a town named Sodom. Or did at one time. The village of Adamant in Calais, VT was originally called Sodom. Then there's Sodom, CT, near North Canaan. While there currently isn't a town in Massachusetts with that name, there is a mountain and a campground in Southwick, MA, named Sodom Mountain. There is also a town in Maine named Sodom. And other places in the country too. And there are many, many roads named Sodom throughout the country.

These days, most people are unfamiliar with the story or even the pejorative term. It has passed out of common usage." – Pam Baker, Halifax, VT.

Sodom was one of the five cities of the plain (Genesis 13:12), and it had a reputation for wickedness; for this, it was destroyed by a rain of sulfur and fire. Naming a place Sodom was intended to remind settlers to be good.

An internet search for towns in USA named Sodom yielded this list:

- Sodom, Kentucky, a ghost town.
- Sodom, New York, a hamlet.
- Sodom, Ohio, an unincorporated community.
- Sodom, West Virginia, an unincorporated community.
- Adamant, Vermont or Sodom.
- Revere, North Carolina or Sodom.
- Sodom, a community within North Canaan, Connecticut.

A site named geotarget.com added places in Europe and Asia:

Cities named Sodom in Russian Federation.

Sodom - Saratov

Sodom - Kirov

Cities named Sodom in Sweden.

Sodom - Vasternorrlands Lan

Cities named Sodom in Israel.

Sodom - HaDarom

So there you have it.

JOAN'S SIGHTINGS. Some of the winter birds are arriving. I have several Evening Grosbeaks, male and female. Still enjoying two pairs of Cardinals. My visiting Rufus-Sided Towhee fueled up for an entire afternoon then was not seen again (but I was excited to have it here). I have Blue Jays but not so many as most years (still *too* many...they clean up the food quickly). But they are a pretty bird. An assortment of Sparrows, Chickadees, and Titmice also visit. — *Joan Courser*

Elsewhere Around Town Up on Hanson Road we see grey foxes, whitetail deer, red squirrels, grey squirrels, mice, pileated woodpeckers, crows, ravens, the broad-winged hawk, chickadees, juncos, and white-throated sparrows. I hear the high-pitched chirping of golden-crowned kinglets. Oddly, a confused moth flutters by from time to time. Patrick saw a Northern Goshawk. It sped out of the forest and attacked a squirrel, which eluded it. Then the 2-foot tall bird sat on the stone wall for a bit before disappearing again. A rare sight around here! I hope you caught the lunar eclipse on November 8th. The eclipse was complete from about 5:15 am to sun-up. A photo I took on Collins Road is at right.

And our first snowfall up here on Hanson Road was November 16, 2022. We shall soon see more of that! Meanwhile, snow tires and slow speeds will be in order. And remember that the speed limit is not about you—it's about everything else out there.



FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS.

November 1, four men responded to a medical call. The person did not realize they had activated their lifeline alarm.

November 3, one fireman responded to a medical call on Wheeler Road; the person was transported by ambulance.

November 3, 10 men responded to a brush fire on Stark Mountain Road. No permit had been issued for this burn. About 3/4 of an acre burned.

November 12, 11 men and one truck responded to Route 112 for a motor vehicle accident. An ambulance also responded, but there was no transport.

November 12, two firemen responded to Stage Road for a woman passed out. Deerfield Valley Ambulance responded but did not transport.

November 14, six men responded to old County Road for a CO alarm sounding; they found high levels in the basement and garage; areas were vented by the firemen.

November 19, four men and an ambulance responded to Hanson Road for a possible untimely death; they waited for the State police to arrive who confirmed the death.

November 23, five men and the ambulance went to Hatch School Road; there was no transport.

November 25, four men responded to a call on Old Stage Road; it was an untimely death. Police were called.
